

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Students from **École Marie Poburan, École Secondaire Sainte Marguerite d'Youville, and École Secondaire St. Albert Catholic High School** experienced a once-in-a-lifetime opportunity earlier this month when they communicated directly with astronaut Mark Pathy. Only three schools in Canada were selected to participate in this program. Students had roughly 10 minutes to speak with Pathy before the ISS (travelling at about 28,000 km/h) zipped out of transmission range. Questions from the students covered topics such as solar flares, weather, and health. Pathy told the students it took him about two days to adjust to life in orbit — in addition to the roughly five-hour time-zone shift (Montreal is on Eastern Standard Time while the station is on Greenwich Mean Time), there is a complete lack of gravity, which makes it feel like you're falling all the time.
